Negative (or Sputnik) Doubles

When partner opens and RHO overcalls in a suit then a double by you is generally played as negative these days – in principle promising the two unbid suits but many players (including me) prefer to play that it just promises an unbid major. Look at this hand: -

↑ 75	Your partner opens 1 ♦. No problem, you simply bid 1 ♥ (you would not,
♥ AJ96	of course, even dream of bidding 1NT and suppressing the 4 card ♥ suit).
♦ Q4	Unfortunately, life is not always that simple, and RHO intervenes with 1 ♠
♣ 98732	So what do you bid now? You cannot support partner's ♦'s with a doubleton.
	2 would show a 5 card suit and 11+ (or 9+ if you play a weak NT) points.

The ♣ suit is too anaemic to bid and you are not strong enough to make a forcing bid at the two level. So 1NT? Does not seem right with a small doubleton in the opponent's suit and with an undisclosed ♥ suit. So that just leaves pass? Now it really would be sad to sell out to 1♠ when you know that your side has *at least* 19 points There is no sensible solution unless you play negative (Sputnik) doubles.

So with this hand you double, and what that means is that you have 4 cards (or more) in the unbid major, so \checkmark 's here. And what are the points requirements? Exactly the same as for $1 \checkmark$ if there had been no overcall, so 6+.

Note that if partner then bids $2 \checkmark$ then that is not a strength showing reverse – in fact it is the opposite. He is simply supporting your suit at the lowest level.
