Stayman

This is a very simple introduction to the Stayman convention.

When partner opens 1NT he may, or may not, have a 4 card major (perhaps both). If we have a 4 card major (or perhaps both majors) then we need to find out if we have a 4-4 fit in a major suit with partner. The best way to find this out is to bid 2. (Stayman). This is a totally artificial bid which asks partner 'do you have a 4 card major suit'?

There are just three possible replies from partner: -

- $2 \blacklozenge$ = no 4 card major
- $2 \checkmark = a \cdot 4 \text{ card } \checkmark \text{ suit (possibly also } 4 \land \text{'s if } 4-4 \text{ in the majors} 0$
- $2 \blacktriangle = a 4 card \blacktriangle suit$

Having established whether there is a major suit fit or not, responder then continues with a pass, an invitational bid or a game forcing bid, depending upon his strength.

Remember, the 2. Stayman bid *promises* at least one 4 card major. That is until we get onto the more complex variations in the NT book.
